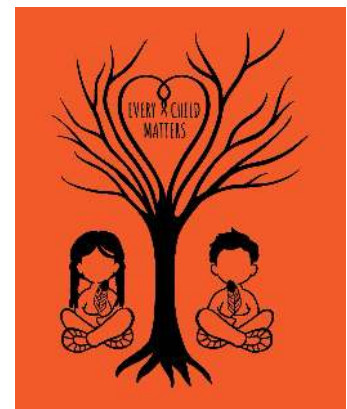

The tree to represent nature and the heart to symbolize that every child matters and is equally important. The children in the design are holding feathers as an Indigenous representation; however, she drew them without faces so that they have no expression and can represent any child. To Sloan, Orange Shirt Day supports Indigenous children and reminds others that all children matter. It is a reminder of Phyllis's story, how as an Indigenous child she had her shirt taken away and her hair cut so that she looked like everyone else.
