

# From the Office

## Safe Arrival - Tait Office (604-668-6444)

If your child is going to be absent from school at any time, please phone the **Tait Office at (604-668-6444)** to report your child's absence. If you get our voicemail, leave your child's name, their division or teacher's name and the reason for their absence. Parents of children who are

unaccounted for at the start of the school day will be contacted to determine their child's whereabouts. We may follow up with a phone call to find out if their absence is due to an illness.

If you send an email to your child's teacher to let them know your child will be absent, you still need to call the school office to report your child's absence. Some mornings are very busy in your child's classroom, and teachers do not always have a chance to look at their morning email before entering student attendance. If a student is marked absent by the teacher and is unaccounted for, someone from the office will call home to find the whereabouts of a child.

# Registration for New Kindergarten Students

We are excited to welcome kindergarten registration applications for children born in 2020, turning 5 in 2025. These children will begin kindergarten in September 2025. Online registration begins November 1, 2024. To register a child for kindergarten, please visit the Richmond School District Web Page. Click 'Student Registration' on the Top Menu

Families are encouraged to register any time during the Priority 1 registration period (November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024 – January 17<sup>th</sup>, 2025) for the best chance at attending their catchment school. All registration applications completed any time during the Priority 1 registration period will receive placement decisions via emails from the school by February 7<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

To join the Students with Disabilities and Divers Abilities Zoom - Please go to the Richmond School District Website >>> Hover on 'Student Registrations' at the top of the Home Page >>> click on 'Kindergarten Registration' in the drop-down menu >>> find the Zoom Link and Passcode half way down the left side of this page.

As per district policy, a student will normally attend the catchment school located in the neighbourhood where their parents or legal guardians reside unless there is no physical, resource or program space available. This provision may need to be applied more frequently, potentially resulting in more students needing placement outside their catchment school.



Please remember to drive slowly when you are near the school and watch for children walking and crossing the street.

## Arriving at School on Time: An Important Life Skill!

Unfortunately, Tait has many children arriving late to school in the mornings!

### SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT .....

When your child is just 5 minutes late every day for his/her class this equates to:

- =5 min/day
- =25 min/week
- =100 min/month
- =1000 min/school year
- =3 1/2 school days missed/year!



Disruption to the rest of the class for the time it takes while a student who is late gets settled and the classroom teacher stops instruction to catch up the student who is late:

- =10min/day or 50 min/week
- $=200+ \min/month$
- =2000+ min/year
- = 2000+ minutes is equivalent to at least 7 full school days of instruction lost for the whole class of students in a year!

Please be considerate of others and ensure your child is not late for school without a good reason. The school doors open at 8:40am, and children should at the school at 8:40am. The bell to start classroom instruction rings at 8:45 a.m. and students should be in their class at their desk or table by this bell.

## DRESS FOR THE COLD AND WET WEATHER:

It is important that students are dressed for the weather. During these colder, damp days, students need to have a proper jacket, footwear (boots or waterproof shoes), and perhaps a hat and gloves. If they dress appropriately for the weather, they can enjoy playing outside. Please remind your child to check the weather when getting up in the morning and they are getting ready for school. All students will be going outside for every recess and lunch - rain or shine. If your child is not well enough to



go outside during our break times, they are also not well enough to be attending school and should stay home until they are feeling better. **If your child is dressed for the weather, they will stay warm and dry.** 

It is a fact that chilldren and adults have <u>less chance</u> of catching a cold or virus when they are outside, with lots of room and fresh air, as opposed to inside in an enclosed space with less air fllow.

# Student Illness - Health and Safety Practices

We are following our Health and Safety Protocols very carefully at Tait. When students arrive at school they are being welcomed and screened by staff to make sure they are healthy.

Recently, we have noticed an increase in the number of students coming to school ill. Please do not send your child to school if they are ill. Sick children and staff should stay home if they are ill, so they recover from illness faster and they do not get others at our school sick.

If an individual has any of these symptoms (fever, constant cough, chills, shortness of breath, diarrhea, nausea or vomiting) they should stay home, until they have recovered and feel better. Do not send your child to school if they have any of the symptoms listed above.

If students appear to be unwell at school, we will call parents to come and pick up their ill child. We know that many parents in our families work and having a child sent home from school can be a burden if you have to leave work, but helping your child recover from illness faster and keeping others at the school safe is a priority. Thank-you for your support in being available to pick up your child if they are unwell.

## **SNOW DAYS - WHAT TO EXPECT:**

Snow days cause inconvenience for everyone. Not all snow days result in a school closure, however, should weather conditions create unsafe situations for students and staff to make it to school, the Superintendent of schools will officially declare schools closed. This decision will be displayed on the school district website by 6:30 am at the latest.


# Around the School
