# From the Office

### CLASS ORGANIZATION AND STUDENT PLACEMENT 2025-26 PARENT INPUT OPPORTUNITY

June is the month when the staff spends considerable time discussing possible classroom placements of students for the next school year. Although we do not finalize classes until the first week in September, we do a great amount of preliminary thinking in June. There are many factors that are important considerations for placing students into appropriate classes for the next school year:

#### A. Student considerations such as:

- a student's learning styles and strengths
- a student's degree of independence and their work habits
- a student's age and physical maturity
- a student's previous year's placement
- what the student can do in relation to the goals of the program
- when a child has been the youngest or the oldest in a combined classroom
- the social and personal characteristics in a class cohort
- the male/female balance in a classroom
- the number of students with diverse learning needs

Please note: Over their 8 years in elementary, a student should experience a variety of settings, sometimes as the older grade in a class and other times the younger grade in a class.

#### B. Staff considerations such as:

- equitable teaching assignments in terms of class size and composition
- matching as closely as possible teaching style with student academic and social emotional needs

Parents, if you have information you would like us to consider when placing your child in a class for next year, please take this opportunity to submit your information to Mr. Mason in writing (email or letter) by Friday, May 30<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 p.m.

This information will be shared with teachers during the meetings that will be held to make up classes for next year.

## • It will not be possible to consider information or requests submitted by parents in September once classes have been established.

• Please **DO NOT request specific teachers** – at this time we do not know which teachers will be teaching which grades next year

### We Are Planning For September 2025



**Kindergarten Registrations:** If you have a child turning five in 2025, please register them at the Board Office right away for Kindergarten. We are now into the Priority

2 Round of registration. Any students living in the Tait neighbourhood can still apply for a place at Tait Elementary, but as we move further towards September 2025, space could become very limited and chances of having a place at our school decrease. If you have a neighbour with a Kindergarten aged child, please encourage them to register today.

### <u>Student Learning Survey</u>

The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents/guardians, teachers, and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for



planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective. In April **2025** the Student Learning Survey will be administered to students in grades 4 and 7 at school.

#### Parents/guardians are Invited to Complete the Student Learning Survey

Parents of students in any grade can voluntarily complete the Student Learning Survey. We encourage parents/guardians to participate in this survey, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement.

The survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the Internet at http://www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat\_survey. Any computer with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure. The survey can be accessed through the link with or without an anonymous logon code by selecting the school district and school name where your child attends school. Provincial, District and School Reports for previous years can be viewed at the same site under the *Results* section.

## Student Absences

If your child will be absent from school, please call the school directly at 604-668-6444 to speak to our office staff or leave a message. Please do not rely on an email to your child's classroom teacher telling them about your child's absence. Classroom teachers may not have the chance to access their email before school and may mark your child as absent with an unknown reason as to why they are missing from school. If classroom teachers enter a child as absent without a reason, our office staff will make a phone call home to parents to find out the whereabouts of a child. This procedure can be aggravating for parents and takes valuable time from our office staff that could be better used.

### **Health Protocols and Sickness**



We can work together to mínímíze the number of students and staff who are ill if we remember some very simple guidelines:

 If you believe your child is coming down with a cold or the flu, keep them home until they have recovered. Your child will recover more quickly at home, and we will not have others in the school also becoming ill.

 $\cdot$  DO NOT send students to school who have a fever, or who have vomited in the last 24 hours.

### Hand Washing

• Encourage your child to wash their hands regularly, especially before eating, after using the washroom, and after blowing their nose. At the school, we will continue to have children wash their hands multiple times each day.

#### <u>Get the Proper Amount of Sleep and Rest</u>

• Have your child go to sleep at a time that gives them at least 10 hours of sleep. When our bodies are tired and 'run down' we are far more susceptible to illness.

## <u>Parking Lot and Surrounding</u> <u>Neighborhood</u>

Parents, please help us make the parking lot and streets near the school safe for all members

of our school community during student pick-up at the end of the day. If you are picking up your child at the end of the school day, please keep these thoughts in mind:

• stop and wait for your child only in the drop-off/pick-up area: if your car is in the drop-off/pick-up area, do not leave your car unattended

· if you need to go into the school, use available parking spaces in our parking lot or park in the neighbourhood

 do not double-park your car in the school parking lot – other cars cannot move easily around double-parked cars and students walking are at risk because they cannot easily see moving cars

· do not park where there are no parking spots - our parking lot has two tight corners closest to the school and parking at these corners makes it hard for other parents to maneuver around your car

 $\cdot$  drive slowly in the parking lot and when exiting the parking lot - students do not always look before they cross the parking lot

· in the neighborhood, please do not block the driveways of our neighbors
