Description of PAC and Gaming Accounts

- The PAC general account is our main operating account where we process deposits and withdrawals. This account is "two-to-sign" meaning two authorized account holders are required to sign for all withdrawals and/or issued cheques.
 - Types of withdrawals: Hot lunch vendor reimbursement, Hot lunch pac supply reimbursement, float for cash boxes, field trip expenses, book draw, Cambie HS scholarship etc.
- The Gaming Account is a separate bank account to hold funds issued by the Community Gaming Grants Branch.
 - Parent Advisory Council (PAC) Grants are intended to benefit K-12 students in B.C., by enhancing extracurricular opportunities and promoting parent and community involvement.
 - PAC: \$20 per student, with a minimum grant of \$2,000 for PACs with fewer than 100 students.
 - For the 2025 2026 year; the Community Gaming Grants Branch has reviewed and approved our organization's PAC grant application for the amount of \$4,660
